

Reflections Holiday Parks Code of Conduct – Dog-friendly

This Code of Conduct is applied to all Reflections Holiday Parks that are dog-friendly and has been compiled to ensure that holidays in our dog-friendly parks are enjoyed by everyone. Special conditions may apply at an individual park.

- The dog owner will contact the dog-friendly Reflections Holiday Park by phone in advance to determine if there is availability for a dog at their park of choice.
- All guests planning to bring a dog/s must book via phone.
- Final acceptance of the dog will be made upon arrival and will be at the discretion of the Park Manager.
- Acceptance requires that the owners observe this code of conduct for the duration of their stay
- Dangerous or aggressive dogs and prohibited breeds will not be accepted at any of our dog-friendly parks.
- Please check on arrival for location of approved exercise areas.
- The dog must be supervised at all times and may not, at any time, be left unattended at the park. This includes the dog being left inside a tent, caravan or other accommodation.
- The dog must be on leash at all times when not inside the dog owners caravan, tent or other accommodation.
- The dog leash must be no more than two metres in length.
- No dog runs are to be erected by dog owners without the permission of the park manager.
- For health and safety reasons, dogs are not permitted in any common areas of the park including: cafes, pool areas, games rooms, camp kitchens, amenities, playgrounds, reception or any public areas.
- Dog owners are responsible for collection and disposal of their dog's waste which must be sealed in a plastic bag and disposed of in a rubbish bin.
- For health and safety reasons dogs must only be washed in the designated dog wash areas.
- Dog related accessories, such dog blankets, may not be washed or cleaned in the park laundry.
- Dog owners are personally responsible and liable for any and all injuries and/or property damage or losses in relation to any actions relating to their dog.
- Dogs may only be walked in areas of the park designated for use by dogs.
- Dogs are not to be exercised around the park, and must exit the park via a designated route.
- The dog owner will monitor and manage the behaviour of their dog.
- The park manager reserves the right to request that a dog and its owner leave the park if the dog is deemed noisy, disruptive, aggressive or inhibits the quiet enjoyment of other guests.
