## **Visitors Leg it to Bermagui and Enjoy Holiday Hikes**

**With the recent announcement from Destination NSW (DNSW) that more than 4.3 million visitors chose to go on a NSW hiking holiday in 2016 there's never been a better time to head to the Sapphire Coast for a trip to South Coast Holiday Parks (SCHP) Bermagui for an outdoor experience at some of the best national parks in the state.**

As outlined by DNSW CEO Sandra Chipchase, the state is home to some of the most stunning coastal and inland trails in Australia, with national parks such as the Sapphire Coast's Gulaga National Park and Montague Island Nature Reserve a true standout for hiking enthusiasts.

Gulaga National Park is home to the ancient volcano *Gulaga*, which has significant cultural importance for women from the local Yuin Indigenous community. Once soaring 2km above sea level, the volcano was a site for storytelling, Indigenous ceremonies and childbirth.

SCHP Bermagui Managers Sara Wilson and Tom Starr said the volcano and surrounding national park was a significant attraction for tourists visiting the area, with a half day walk to the peak starting at the nearby historic towns of Tilba Tilba and Central Tilba.

"A brilliant but somewhat tough walk takes you to the summit of *Gulaga* which provides astounding views of the adjacent hinterland and coastline, as well as Montague Island Nature Reserve," Tom said.

"You can also take part in guided walks which provide an insight into the area's Aboriginal cultural significance, geological features and its historic gold mining status."

Before working at the Bermagui Park Tom gave guided tours of Montague Island Nature Reserve, which can be accessed from the mainland at nearby Narooma. An abundance of birdlife such as Little Penguins, Sea Eagles, Swamp Harriers and Peregrine Falcons call the island home, which is better known to Indigenous Communities as *Baranguba*, the son of *Gulaga*.

"Montague Island is just a short boat trip from the mainland and if you're lucky you may catch dolphins and even whales swimming past exploring the open sea," Tom said.

"A guided walking tour allows visitors to experience the Island's historic lighthouse, a walk through the lighthouse keepers residences and the cultural and geological history found on the idyllic nature reserve.

"This medium-difficulty walk also leads you to Montague Island's penguin breeding boxes, with tour guides giving an insight into the variety of conservation and revegetation programs which have been put in place to protect the species."
