- Open-air cinema experience
- Enjoying a self-catered picnic or purchase food items from event vendors
- Purchasing tickets in the RSPCA NSW raffle
- Fresh popcorn via a gold coin contribution with free entry into a Lucky Door Prize raffle upon registration
- A large inflatable slide for registered attendees to use free of charge

There is a small registration fee for event attendees, with children three years and under admitted free.

RSPCA NSW Senior Manager Eliza Walker said families and dog lovers would enjoy a great evening while supporting an important service at Coffs Harbour.


"RSPCA NSW offers shelter, medical attention and love to animals of all shapes and sizes, as well as supporting community members in caring for their pets," Ms Walker said.

"RSPCA NSW is a charity and receives only 2% of its funding from the government – the ongoing support of local animal lovers is essential in allowing us to continue our work. Doggy Date Night is a fun community initiative which will help raise those much-needed funds."
